

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION MODULE: YEAR 3—FIRST EUCHARIST AND THE MASS

In this module students will explore Jesus' real presence with us when we participate and share in the celebration of the Eucharist and the way its various parts form a cohesive whole. 'FAMILIES COME GATHER' MASSES



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
