As Catholic disciples we seek to live like Jesus in the way we are and the things we do. Our actions and words reflect Jesus' way of being in his life. It influences our choices and most importantly why we care for and serve others. It influences what we value, our commitments and the goals we strive towards.

There comes a time in our lives when we are able to reflect upon our impact on others and lead others to live in the way that Jesus would want. A leader recognises potential and finds ways to invite individuals to share their gifts with, and for, the community. In order to help others recognise their gifts the leader must first get to know and understand others, their gifts, feelings and aspirations.

Jesus modelled servant leadership to us and this is the way that we are called to lead in our lives. Students will explore how Jesus modelled leadership and taught about leading through love in his parables.

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
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
