CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK

Next week marks the beginning of Catholic Schools Week.

Catholic Schools Week is an important time to celebrate the sense of belonging within our school community and the launch of the enrolment period for 2019. Our open morning is planned for 14 March from 9:15am. We hope to welcome new prospective parents and students to our school as we opened classrooms and showcase the spiritual, academic and creative opportunities offered here at St Cecilia's. If you have a younger child ready to start school in 2019 it is important to collect an enrolment package from the office and return it at your earliest convenience.

Following our open morning Year 3 parents are invited to attend an open forum at 10.30am to give feedback regarding the flexible learning arrangements introduced Yr 3.

POP UP PLAY

Our first Pop-Up-Play opportunity for 2018 will coincide with open morning on Wednesday 14 March. The group is open to all pre-schoolers and their parents. Pop-Up-Play is held in the Secret Garden. Thank you to Alison Westh and Liz Psychogios who will again coordinate the group. Dates for term 2 are Wednesday 9 May and Friday 15 June, 9am-10:15am in the Secret Garden.

PARENT NETWORK MEETING

Our first general meeting for the Parent Network team is on Tuesday 6 March at 7pm. All parents K to 6 are encouraged to attend. We have a full agenda and lots of information for parents. The Parent Network Meeting is a great way to keep informed with what is happening around the school both socially and academically and offer constructive feedback to the school and the team.

READING WORKSHOP KINDERGARTEN AND YEAR 1 PARENTS TUESDAY 13 MARCH 7:30PM

Kindergarten parents are invited to attend a workshop aimed at supporting you to help your child with reading at home. When parents and the school work together to assist students the child always benefits. Any parent with a Year 1 child or older who is struggling to get their child to read at home is also welcome to attend. We have intentionally made the meeting quite late as we are mindful of parents needing to attend to the normal bedtime routines of young children and would like as many parents to attend as possible.

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Last Monday Georgia Gibson, Rachel Macri and Catherine Doyle attended *Cultures of Thinking, Community of Practice* a professional learning opportunity funded by the Diocese. At St Cecilia's we have been implementing the *Cultures of Thinking* practice across all key learning areas for the past three years. We are very mindful of a K to 6

approach in teaching and learning. This was an opportunity for the girls to be inducted into the practice. The girls also attended *Ob Survey* training last Friday. *Ob Survey* is an assessment tool for early literacy.

Last year Gabrielle Williams attended EMU (Extending Mathematical Understanding) training. This year Angela Pelling will attend the training. That brings the number of EMU specialists presently on staff to five, Damien O'Brien, Nick Dowler, Gabrielle Williams, Angela Pelling and myself. These teachers will co teach with other staff to ensure the practice is consistent across the school. Damien O'Brien, Nikki Delrennie and I will also attend a mathematical course, Encouraging Persistence, Maintaining Challenge (EPMC) aimed at our senior students.

Damien O'Brien will continue to attend numeracy network meetings and Stephanie Harding the literacy professional learning meetings.

All teachers will receive professional learning in Literacy on Tuesday 3 April. **This will be a Pupil Free Day**. This Pupil Free Day comes at the end of the Easter break giving families an extra day to get back into Sydney and avoid the Easter traffic. The children will return to school on Wednesday 4 April.

YEAR 2: RELIGIOUS EDUCATION MODULE: 'Jesus Shows Me How to Love'

In this module, students will explore how Jesus is the model for Christian love. They will learn that love was very important to the people of Jesus' time who followed the Law of Moses by loving God and other people (neighbour). Students will then explore how Jesus put a new emphasis on the understanding of love. Jesus' new commandment "*Love one another as I have loved you*" emphasises the call to love for Jesus' disciples and for us as well. Children will learn that Jesus' way of loving calls

us to put into action our love. Especially, we should always love those who are poor and marginalised.

'FAMILIES COME GATHER' MASSES

Our first 'Families Come Gather' Mass for the year was last Sunday. Thank you to the Stage 3 students and their families for their prayerful participation in the Mass.

<u>FIRST RECONCILIATION</u>: The weekend masses were also an opportunity to acknowledge the students who are preparing for their First Reconciliation. These students participated in the **Ritual of the Cross**, receiving a crucifix as a symbol of their continuing relationship with Jesus.

<u>PRAYER ASSEMBLY:</u> We are looking forward to celebrating our first Prayer Assembly for 2018. It will be held on **Monday 5 March** in the church. **Year 4** will be leading the assembly and sharing some of their learning experiences in Religious Education. The assembly will begin at **2:30pm** in the church.

Volunteering Process

By now, everyone will have received information on our **NEW Volunteering Process for 2018** including all events and other opportunities. We strongly encourage all families to consider how they can volunteer *at least once each term* - this may just be 1-2 hours per family, but added up, means we are all contributing to our vibrant community here at St Cecilia's.

Good Sam Day

We are recognising **Good Sam Day** this term by encouraging "**acts of service**" for others. At times life seems too busy to even think about what we could do for others, so here are some simple ideas:

- For children little things like tidying your room or setting the table without being asked can make Mum or Dad smile. Or at school asking someone to play if they are sitting in the "friendship spot".
- For parents even the simplest offer of a cup of tea or taking the kids for a walk so the other person can have a break can really make someone else's day.

In the spirit of serving others and reflecting on the story of **Rattanak from Cambodia**, which focuses on the needs of people with hearing impairments, students will be taught some simple sign language in the classroom. GIFT: Giving in Faith Together

What is it? GIFT is a local outreach program, founded by a group of St Cecilia's mums in 2013 and sponsored mainly by our North Harbour Parish. Its mission is to raise awareness of the hidden struggles of some of our neighbours on the Northern Beaches and to offer opportunities for the community to provide support in a spirit of respect, compassion and generosity.



How does it work? Regular cook-offs are held at our Parish Centre in Manly Vale. Simple nutritious recipes are provided and all ingredients are delivered to the kitchen. *Cook-offs are held Monday evenings or daytime. It takes approximately 2 - 2.5 hours to prepare around 100 meals*, they are frozen and collected on Fridays by the Link Community Food Care Program at Cromer and supplied free of charge to families in need.

How does it work?

During the school year, the class parents, on behalf of other parents in the class, will coordinate the following gifts as appropriate:

- · Gifts to celebrate the arrival of a new baby of a class family or other major life event
- Teacher(s) and staff gifts for birthdays plus end of year gifts (This aligns with the Diocese Gift and Hospitality Policy)
- Funds can also be used as appropriate to purchase gifts for families experiencing a bereavement or family illness

When should I contribute?

QKR is now open for collections to be made by year to be used for gifts during the year. Logon to QKR under Parent Network payments.

- 1. Download QKR and register (if you already haven't done so)
- 2. Open QKR
- 3. Click St Cecilia's Catholic Primary School
- 4. Click under Parent Network- Parent network payments
- 5. Find your year's class parent gift collection
- 6. Add to cart- Confirm and pay

If you wish to provide gifts privately, please note that all staff are unable to accept gifts that are over \$75 in value as part of their terms of employment. This is common to many organisations employment terms these days. In addition, all gifts need to be declared.
