MOTHERS' MONDAY 7 MAY FOR MOTHERS OF STUDENTS IN YEARS 1, 3, 5

Parent participation and involvement in their child's education has shown to develop a more positive attitude towards learning.

On Monday 7 May we invite the mothers of students in Year 1, 3 and 5 to spend the morning from 9am till 1pm in the classroom with their child.

Students can bring their mother or a significant female along to spend the morning at school with them. Due to space constraints unfortunately we can only accommodate one visitor per Year 5, 3 or Year 1 student.

Feedback from last year was that parents prefer a half day. Our program will include structured class activities followed by a Mothers' Day liturgy and assembly at 12:15pm allowing for parents to leave at 1pm. An outline of the day for each grade will be emailed home attached to the lesson intents on the Friday before Mothers' Monday. We understand that not all parents can commit to the entire morning and they are welcome to attend any part of the session that fits in with their work schedule.

ST CECILIA'S IS PLASTIC FREE

As a result of Year 1's inquiry unit in term 1 St Cecilia's will go plastic from the beginning of term 2. We ask parents to pop children's lunches in lunch boxes without cling wrap or foil. To make children more aware of their own rubbish Year 1 has also asked that children put their rubbish back in their lunch boxes and take it home each day. This will heighten awareness of individual footprints left behind each day. Please take this as opportunity to discuss the consequences of rubbish left behind for future generations.

SCIENCE INCURSIONS

Over the past week all classes have had the opportunity to attend a Science incursion based on this term's Science unit studied in class. Alana Wylie is a real scientist who has arranged hands-on science experiments for each age group. The children have been excited and engaged despite being challenged to problem solve and use higher order thinking strategies to hypothesise and suggest reasons for their findings. The incursions were funded by money raised by the Parent Network Team at the Gala Dinner last year. Our intention is to hold an incursion per grade each term.

Here is what the children in kindergarten had to say:

- *Eliza P: I learned that scientists use a pipette to suck up liquids*
- *Patrick D: I learned that the sun makes water go up to the clouds*
- *Rufus M: I learned that scientists make lots of experiments*
- *Scarlett H: I learned that scientist use big words*




ENROLLING NOW FOR 2019

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2019 are now open. Families with children ready to start school next year need to complete an enrolment form and return it to the office at your earliest convenience, preferably before end of term.

END OF TERM

The last day of term 1 is this Friday 13 April. Children will break for a two week holiday period. Term 2 commences on Monday 30 April. Due to our unpredictable weather, on their return to school, parents are able to choose to send their children in *either* full winter uniform or full summer uniform until 21 May. Monday 21 May will be the official date for all children to wear full winter uniform. We ask parents to please ensure the children do not mix the two uniforms eg if boys are wearing long pants they also need to wear a long sleeved shirt with a tie.



A reminder to all our parents ahead of the break at the end of Term 1 that School Zones remain in place for the safety of our children and families on all gazetted school days, which are all days the school is open, even pupil free days.

‘SEEKERS’ SUPPLIES’ HAMPER APPEAL

At St Cecilia’s Catholic School we are committed to developing a connected and inclusive Catholic community that reflects the Gospel values. We strive to draw on and continue the work done by the founders of our school, the Good Samaritan Sisters, by reaching out with compassion and justice to people in need within and beyond our immediate community.



One way we do this is by participating in the ‘Seekers’ Supplies’ appeal. Each year our St Cecilia’s school community donates hampers of non-perishable food and household goods to the Asylum Seeker Centre for families and individuals <https://asylumseekerscentre.org.au>. This is part of the North Harbour Parish’s Social Justice Initiative. Further information will be sent home with the children early in Term 2, detailing the types of goods to donate and bring in during early-mid May for the hampers. At the end of May, we will be asking parents to help collate the hampers and transport them to the Asylum Seeker Centre.

YEAR 2: LENT TO EASTER MODULE

The module focuses on the prayerful aspect of Lent and the opportunities the Lenten Season offers students to reflect upon prayer and places to pray. Students will be given a variety of experiences of both formal and informal prayer settings and will be encouraged to appreciate the value of silence in prayer, providing the students with opportunities to look for, know and find God within themselves. The module highlights a key aspect of prayer during the Lenten period; expressing sorrow for any ways in which we have failed to be all that we can be in relationship with God and others.

Students are encouraged to reflect upon Jesus' prayer to the Father in the Garden of Gethsemane. They examine the prayerful aspect of Holy Week, focusing on the example of Jesus who was able to talk with God his Father about his feelings, fears and problems. The types of prayers explored in this module include, vocal, meditative and contemplative. Students will be given opportunities to explore and build upon their learning.

Students will explore the themes of Lent and Easter in a creative and integrated way. Through participation and involvement in the module as well as in whole school Lent and Easter activities and celebrations, students will gain an awareness of the stories, actions and symbols of Lent and Easter.

CORE VALUE ASSEMBLY



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

Orthodontic treatment is a long-term process and it is always happy to answer any questions or concerns regarding early orthodontic treatment. If your child is not ready to start orthodontic treatment, they will receive periodic reviews to monitor their dental development. They will advise you when it is time to start the practice and ensure that treatment is carried out at the convenience.
