### Fr John Frauenfelder's Words of Wisdom – 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time: 2nd September 2018

## Religious Education

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION MODULE: KINDERGARTEN 'GOD IS OUR CREATOR'



The emphasis in this module is to give students opportunities to explore and develop an appreciation for the wonders of God's creation. This module will begin to **build a sense of spiritual connectedness** that transcends the individual and builds a **living relationship with God**. At their intuitive stage of faith development in which young children exhibit egocentric thinking, this spiritual journey will be constructed out of their own experiences of the natural world. **Students will explore the story of creation using varied sensory experiences**. They will be invited to recognise, enjoy and celebrate aspects of the natural world around them and to make a connection between the gifts of nature and their responsibility to care for creation. **The first creation story from Genesis** will be used as a visually rich story of God's creative power. Children will be introduced to the idea that this Bible story is not a factual account of creation but **a religious story about God's love for us and for all of creation**. The story of **St Francis of Assisi** may be used to show a love of creation that was a reflection of God's love. Children will be challenged to find ways to demonstrate such love in their own lives.

### STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY MONDAY 3 SEPTEMBER—'SWEETER THAN HONEY' SUMMIT FOLLOW-UP

Teachers will be participating in a Staff Development Day on Monday September. This day will be held off-site and in conjunction with the staff from St Kieran's School, Manly Vale.

This day will be focused on providing teachers with an engaging and meaningful encounter with Scripture in order to develop their own faith and offer practical ways to transfer this to the learning environment with the students. The content of the day will be a follow-up to the recent 'Sweeter than Honey' Scripture Summit attended by Nikki Delrennie and Gabrielle Williams. These teachers also shared their learning with staff at a recent professional learning session, attended by Monica Officer and Dr Anthony Maher from the Catholic Schools Office.

Dr Maher presented a session to teachers on Pope Francis' latest exhortation *Gaudete Et Exsultate*. This document provides people with a practical message about recognising the 'holiness' in each of us. Dr Maher summarised these 'Steps to Holiness'. This is an affirming and uplifting message for us all!
