#### NEW CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD (CLOW) CO-ORDINATOR NEEDED FOR NORTH HARBOUR PARISH

I have really enjoyed co-ordinating and being involved with children's liturgy for many years now. I remember starting children's liturgy when my first daughter, Sarah was in Kindergarten at St Kieran's school and Sarah is now 23 years old so we're looking at over 18 years. I can't even remember when I took on the role as co-ordinator but it probably was a couple of years after starting as a volunteer. I can truly say that Children's Liturgy together with being a Catechist is the most satisfying and rewarding ministries that I have been a part of. However, I feel that it is time for me to step down as co-ordinator and a volunteer of children's liturgy and for someone else to take on this very satisfying and rewarding role.

I am looking for someone to take on this role beginning in Term 4 of this year, Monday, 15 October. You may even wish to share this role with a friend or two.

So you may ask what's involved in being co-ordinator of children's liturgy? Here are some points:

- At the beginning of the year a roster for St Cecilia's and St Kieran's is put together.
- Each week on Mondays or Tuesdays resources (readings, prayers of the faithful and activity sheets) are put
  together and delivered to the persons who are rostered on for that week. Most of the resources are already
  photocopied and filed in folders and it's only the occasional week that you need to photocopy from scratch.
- You liaise with the volunteers of both St Cecilia's and St Kieran's churches.

# 500 Dr Kristy Goodwin

Did you miss the recent free talk with Dr Kristy Goodwin?

- Parents need to be pilots of the digital plane (not the passenger): our kids need guidance and direction about how to navigate the Digital world – we must take an active role as parents.
- Keep devices out of bedrooms: research is confirming the digital devices in bedrooms delay the onset & quality of sleep plus there are safety concerns with devices not in common areas.



- 3. Balance kids screen time and green time: kids still need outdoor unstructured play, as natural sunlight may help to prevent my Opia (misogynist) and is essential for brain function.
- Focus on more than simply how much screen time kids are accumulating: Also consider what, when, where, with whom and how much screens are being used, as time is only one aspect.
- 5. Be mindful of our own digital habits kids are literally wired to imitate. As parents we need to be mindful of how they using digital devices, as parental digital destruction has resulted in increasing rates of childhood playground injuries and is changing child parent interactions.

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
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
