YEAR 1 EXCURSION TO SUSANNAH PLACE MUSEUM

Last week as part of the History Inquiry Unit 'The Past in the Present', Year 1 went on an excursion to Susannah Place in The Rocks, Sydney. Susannah Place is a small house and shop that was owned by the Cunningham family in the 1800's. Students had the opportunity to explore how people lived in

the past, and what aspects of the past are still present today. Students reflected on their visit and were able to identify some differences in the way people lived.



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


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
