#### GOOD SAM DAY

In class we have been looking at people and countries around the world who live under extreme pressure or have been displaced from their country due to the outbreak of civil wars. These people have been assisted by a charity called Caritas Australia. Last week, everyone in the school brought



in a coin to donate to Project Compassion. As a school we have decided to donate the money raised to Project Compassion which is run by Caritas Australia. In doing this we helped people in need and people who are less fortunate than us. Every class designed their own stickers of Hope, with a meaningful message written on it. These stickers were a great way for each student to stop and think about those who we were giving hope to.

#### CARITAS AUSTRALIA

Caritas Australia is a program that is run for people in need around the world, for example a girl in Zimbabwe called Thandolwayo. She is young girl who is our age and has to travel three hours every day to the only water supply near her village. The water that she was collecting made their stomachs sore and meant that the children were tired for learning. Caritas Australia helps people like Thandolwayo through Project Compassion where we donate money so that Caritas Australia can provide clean water to young girls like Thandolwayo and other people in her village.

In our school we can help Caritas by donating a gold coin to Project Compassion. For example, if we raise \$5 we can provide a school in the Solomon Islands with clean tap water each day. If we raise \$45 it can provide students in Zimbabwe with school stationery supplies. If we raise \$100 we can supply the First Australians with nutritional food for a community bush picnic to strengthen cultural bonds to the community and country. This is how our school are giving hope to the people who need it in the world for Lent.

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
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
