Our guest speakers at our Term 2 general meeting will be our school captains who will address sustainability and what we hope to achieve at St Cecilia's.

WAR ON WASTE



In line with community initiatives St Cecilia's is striving to go plastic free. We ask parents to support our learning opportunity by not sending lunches to school wrapped in single use plastic or foil. To make children more aware of their own rubbish we also asked that children not bring food packaging to school but recycle it in their recycling bins at home. We are also encouraging students to take home uneaten lunch to have as afternoon tea or compost. Unfortunately our recycling capacity at school is limited. Taking rubbish home will heighten awareness of the

individual footprint left behind each day. Please make this an opportunity to discuss with your child, the consequences of rubbish left behind on future generations.

Remember also to label lunchboxes and drink bottles so that they can be returned to the children each day.

On Friday Mrs Cunningham, the SRC and the environment captains will lead a war on waste. After lunch they will tip out our bins to highlight rubbish collected in 1 day. The aim is for the students to appreciate the amount of good food going to waste and realise that 8 bins of rubbish can actually be reduced to a third of a garbage bag a day if they are mindful of our waste. Thank you to Sonia Walsh who will support the children in this venture and what we are trying to achieve with our war on waste.

We are hoping in the near future to extend bin free Thursdays to include Tuesdays as well.

Congratulations to KB on winning the Environment Cup for having the most sustainable lunchboxes over the period of a week.
