15 August: Feast of the Assumption

The program for the day is as follows.

- 10:30am Visits to classrooms- a visit to the Book Fair may occur in this time
- Morning Tea for students in playground Book Fair continues 11:00am
- 11.30am Grandparents/friends depart school, children return to class

The social committee will call on class parents to help organise the morning tea for our guests.

BOOK WEEK: "READING IS MY SECRET POWER"

It is that time of year again. Numerous activities/incursion/learning experiences will take place at St Cecilia's during book week. These will include:

- Grandparents Day Friday the 23 August Book fair/stall in the hall.
- Author visit and book week parade Tuesday 20 August. Students dress as their favourite book character and bring the book the character is from, to school, to share with friends
- Buddy reading- during peer support. Students are invited to bring their favourite book to share with other children on Thursday 22 August
- One shortlisted book will be allocated to each class. Beginning next week and during Book Week the children will engage in learning tasks associated with the book.

SUSTAINABIITY

Last week four of our school leaders attended a learning opportunity at Taronga Zoo. The aim was to empower, educate and support Broken Bay Primary Environmental Leaders in their Earth Stewardship responsibility enabling them to build the capacity of their school communities in the "Care of our Common Home".

You will have noticed that as a school we have undertaken a number of initiatives, many of which have been led by the students. We have

- Continued a focus on sustainable lunchboxes and reducing the waste we bring and create at school
- Planted a tree donated by Northern Beaches Council and Manly Dam Bushcare as part of national *Plant a Tree Day*
- Commenced plastic recycling and the collection of soft plastic recycling
- Made changes to reduce rubbish at the school disco
- Received a grant for the installation of a native bee hive from the Catholic Schools Office
- Applied for a NSW government grant to install a native garden
- Created a teacher/ parent/ student environment team comprising Terese Cunningham, Alana McLaren, Sonia Walsh, Joanna Trube. Melanie Blankenstein, Rob Pyne and our student leaders
- Introduced bin free Tuesday and Thursday when bins are taken off the playground and children are encouraged to recycle their waste at home.

We have also taken delivery of a big red box that is sitting outside the foyer (made by the Manly Men's shed). This forms part of our exciting new partnership with Boomerang Bags Manly and a workshop we will run on Father's Friday to make a reusable shopping bag out of an item of clothing that would ordinarily be thrown away. The bags we make will then be put into circulation in the current box network. Our aim is to teach children that materials can be reused to make useful items and reduce the need for people to use plastic bags when shopping. Our box will eventually relocate to Balgowlah Heights shops for the general public to use.

Please send old t-shirts/ singlets in with your child (not ones that could be sold by a charity but the ones with holes or stretched head holes) to be placed in the box. We are also happy to take your stash of spare reusable shopping bags so next time you forget your bag whilst you are shopping they'll be available where you need them.

COMPASS

Exciting news – an office kiosk and a new parent portal!

Next week you will see a change in the school office – the installation of a Compass Kiosk. The Kiosk looks like a large ipad and is to be used by parents who pick up their child/ren early and for late arrivals.

Also, shortly you will receive details about a Compass Parent Portal and App which will enable you to access information online about your child/ren, anytime, anywhere, from any modern web-enabled device. Initially you will be able to –

- View information on your child/ren's attendance
- Enter explanations for absences
- Receive communications
- Update your contact details

BOOK WEEK 2019 SATURDAY 17 - 23 AUGUST



The Book Week theme for 2019 is "Reading is My Secret Power".

Book Week is organised by the Children's Book Council of Australia. Established in 1945, the CBCA was founded at a time when Australian children's books were few, and Australian authors and illustrators were virtually unknown. In 1946 the CBCA established annual book awards to promote Australian children's books of outstanding literary and artistic quality. These awards are now the most influential and highly respected in Australia.

Activities organised at St Cecilia's to celebrate books during Book Week include:

- Monday to Friday: Each class will take a short listed book and work with it in class as their shared text for the week.
- Tuesday 20 August: Yvette Poshoglian author of the popular Ella and Olivia series, the Frankie Fox Girl • Spy books and My Australian Story: Escape from Cockatoo Island will be sharing her love of books and passion for writing with all the students.
- Thursday 20 August: all students are asked to bring a favourite picture book to share with their peer support group.
- Friday 23 August: We will be holding our annual book fair in the hall. Students, parents and grandparents are all invited to purchase books for themselves or as a donation to the school library. Stephanie Harding
