AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNICATIONS AND THE ARTS

When choosing a movie for your child to watch please consider classification ratings. The following information is from the Australian Government Department of Communications and the Arts

QUICK GUIDE TO CLASSIFICATION RATINGS

You've probably seen these classification symbols before. But how do you actually use them?

G rated films and games are OK for most kids, but remember, even some of these can be scary to the littlies.

A **PG** rating means Parental Guidance under 15. You may need to take care with these films and games, and maybe explain some of the content to your kids.

M is for mature, and we don't recommend these films and games for kids under 15.

MA 15+ stands for Mature Accompanied. These movies and games have strong content. That's why shops and cinemas are not legally allowed to sell under 15s MA 15+ games or movies without a parent or guardian present. Finally, films and games with an **R 18+** rating are only for adults as they have high impact content.

So when you're deciding what's ok to watch or play, check the classification rating.


Student Voice


