ACADEMIC AWARDS

Teachers are also finalising academic awards for the year. These awards will be handed out at the Core Value Award Assembly on Monday 16 December. Two awards will be handed out per class based on end of year assessment in combination with consistency of academic performance throughout the year. Purpose:


- To encourage students to focus on the importance and relevance of strong spelling skills when writing.
