PARENT NETWORK COMMITTEE

Our new Parent Network committee have had a busy start to the year. To date they have organised class parents, the Kindy picnic, tea and tissues, volunteers for the canteen and are busily working on the *Welcome Evening* and the *Gala Dinner*. Please accept the community's heartfelt thanks, for it is this work in the background that builds the inclusive welcoming community at St Cecilia's. I look forward to catching up with new families and existing families at the *Welcome Evening* on 22 February.

CODING

Coding lessons have been made possible due to the generosity of the parent body at St Cecilia's and the fund raising efforts of the Parent Network team. Lessons resumed this week. iPads, Chrome Books and Bee Bots will be used in the Year 1 and Kindergarten classes as parents felt they had not yet developed the computer skills needed to navigate the complex world of coding. Bee Bots are small robots that can be programmed as an introduction to coding.

The company Cod4fun who facilitate the coding program here at St Cecilia's are also keen to begin a before school club for those who would like their children in Years 2 to 4 to be extended beyond what they are learning in class. CLASS PARENT MEETING

Thank you to all the parents who have agreed to take on the Class

Parent role for 2020. This is a privileged position that comes with some responsibility. A *Class Parent* meeting will be held in the school hall at 2:30pm tomorrow, Thursday, afternoon to discuss the role. It is important that at least one class parent from each year group attend.

SWIMMING CARNIVAL

The 2020 School Swimming Carnival for Years 2 - 6 is at Manly Swimming Centre Balgowlah Road, Manly is fast approaching. Details of the event were emailed home yesterday. Thank you to parents who worked with us to solve the technical hitches that go along with on-line <u>bookings</u>. All problems should now be solved. If you had trouble entering your child into races please try again. Please note non swimmers still attend the carnival as spectators and form the cheer squad. Children not entered into an event cannot enter a race on the day as the online form doubles as permission from the parent for the child to enter the water. Without this consent prior to the carnival we cannot let your child enter the water. It is OK for a child who is entered into a race not to swim if they change their mind. The carnival will run from 9:00 – 11:30am. **Parents transport their own children to the pool**. At the conclusion of the swimming carnival, buses will transport children back to school. It is a regular school day and school will continue as usual in the afternoon.

Ribbons will be awarded at assembly the following Monday once the overall 50 metre event winners (not the winners of heats) have been determined based on times collected. Please take the time to explain this to your child to avoid disappointment on the day.

Please note: **Kindergarten and Year 1 do not attend the carnival**. They will attend school as usual where their teachers will arrange fun activities to ensure they are not disappointed.

KISS AND RIDE

Kiss and Ride zone operates between 8.30-9.30am and 2.30-3.30pm. During these times the restrictions are enforced by Council Rangers.

- 'DO NOT GET OUT OF CARS in White St' when dropping off and picking up students in the Kiss and Ride Zone
- **'DO NOT REVERSE PARK or jump the queue in White St'** but **move along with the flow of cars** in a line to collect or drop off your child in the allocated area.
- Remember 'NO PARKING' restrictions do apply
- If the traffic is banked across the roundabout it may be necessary for parents to drive around the block.
- If students are not present at the pickup zone for any reason, parents may be asked to drive around the block

If parents wish to come into the school playground they are asked to park their cars in Wanganella and Seaview Street and to enter and exit the school yard via the gates in Wanganella and Seaview Streets.

- Students for "Kiss and Ride" sit on the driveway inside the gate in the afternoon.
- Cars are to have the "family name sign" visible on front window- the school has issued one sign per family (from office) If more than one sign is required please notify the office.
- Supervision of students ceases at 3.30pm. If students have not been collected they will be taken to After School Care where the afternoon fee will be required.

Thank you to parents for working with the school so that all students are kept safe and parents can pick up and drop off students efficiently. If you prefer not to use this service please be considerate of our neighbours and refrain from parking across their driveways or in the parking bays of nearby units even for short periods of time.

STUDENT SAFETY

- Supervision before school begins at 8:30am. Any child arriving before this time is required to book into Before School Care with Camp Australia.
- Similarly, in the afternoon supervision is provided until 3:30pm. After that time children are required to go to After School Care.
- Just a reminder that in the interest of student safety the play equipment is only open at recess and lunch when classes are rostered and teachers are available for supervision.

PROCEDURE WHEN A CHILD IS ABSENT

Regular attendance at school is essential to assist children to reach their potential. However if your child is sick we encourage you to keep them at home until they are well enough to return to school. On the day of the absence please log the absence on Compass including the reason for the absence. No other action is required.

Any child arriving after the bell in the morning needs to be signed in at the office by a parent. It is the parent's responsibility to complete the on-line, sign- in, using the kiosk in the foyer which will print out a receipt. The child then hands the print-out to the teacher as they enter the classroom. Any child entering the classroom without the late slip needs to return to the office to ensure they are marked present for the day. Late arrivals and early departure must only be entered via the Compass kiosk at the school office.

In an effort to reduce children's anxiety please remember to make medical and specialist appointments outside school time. Parents are also encouraged to note term dates when booking family holidays.

Finally please remember I am always available to support students and parents with any difficulties that arise. The staff and I are looking forward to the year ahead.
