## Principal's News

### *Words of Wisdom – 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent – 8<sup>th</sup> March 2020*

*In the movie 'A Beautiful Day in the Neighbourhood' Lloyd Vogel's meeting Mister Rogers turned out to be an experience of "transfiguration." Fred Rogers brings out of the cynical magazine writer the love and good will that are buried deep within him. We all experience such moments of "transfiguration" in our lives: when the love of God that exists within each one of us transforms our lives and the lives of those we love. It's exactly that love — that "divinity" — that Peter, James and John see in Jesus on the mount of the transfiguration. The power of that sacred presence shines through us, as well, even when we don't notice it or are unaware of it. Fred Rogers reflects that "transfiguring" love of Christ for Lloyd Vogel (as well as the millions of children who have watched his show over the years); God now calls us to "transfigure" our Lenten world into the "neighbourhood" of God.*

#### **CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK and OPEN DAY**

Catholic Schools Week is an important time to celebrate the sense of belonging within our school community and the launch of the enrolment period for 2021. Our **Open Morning** is planned for **17 March from 9:15am**. We hope to welcome new prospective parents and students to our school as we open classrooms and showcase the spiritual, academic and creative opportunities offered here at St Cecilia's. If you have a younger child ready to start school in 2021 it is important to collect an enrolment package from the office or download it from our web page and return it at your earliest convenience.

During our Open Morning we will also hold our *Open to Learning Morning* when we invite all parents to visit their children in the classroom. It is also a good opportunity to visit other classes and get a feel for the open classroom structure in the primary grades.

#### **PARENT NETWORK**

Thank you to all the parents who attended our first Parent Network meeting for the year last night. Our guest speaker from the Catholic Schools Parent body shared insightful tips on Positive Behaviours for Learning in the classroom and how the same techniques can be used at home. We have a few flyers left over that can be picked up from the office: *Getting Behaviour in Shape at Home* and an example of a *Home Positive Behaviours Matrix*. The big take-away was 'it only takes 8 practices to form an undesirable behaviour but 28 consistent practices to break it.'

We also spoke about the professional learning staff are focusing on this year which involves *Deep Learning* and *Gifted Education*. All staff will complete a Certificate of Gifted Education with UNSW on the 1 and 2 May. 1 May will therefore be a pupil free day. More information to come.

Our Learning Together Playgroups will run again this year for all families with a toddler of any age. Friends of the family are also welcome. Our playgroup is held twice a term, once on a Tuesday and once on a Friday. Please come along and meet other mums and dads in the school.


## NAPLAN 2020

This year NAPLAN for Years 3 and 5 will be held from 12 - 22 May. NAPLAN is a national assessment and our students will participate *Online*. Year 3 and 5 will complete the Reading, Conventions of Language, and Numeracy test *Online*. Year 5 will also complete the Writing test *Online* whilst Year 3 will complete the Writing test as a written paper. I can confirm the children will be given the opportunity to practise the computer skills needed to complete the assessment at school. Parents need to remember not to make a big fuss of the assessment and to ensure the children don't become anxious. Please ensure that you do not plan a family holiday during this time.

- K-2 Challenge: you can read the books on your own, read them with someone, or someone can read them to you.
- Years 3-4, 5-6 and 7-9 Challenges: you must read the books on your own, but someone can help you choose them.
- In an approved series on the PRC booklist, you can read any three books as PRC books. You can read up to five other books from the same series as Personal Choice books.

Student passwords remain the same as those used last year. Students new to the school including all Kindergarten students will be registered by 6 March and their passwords are available from their classroom teacher or Mrs Harding.

### CORONAVIRUS CURRENT ADVICE TO SCHOOLS

#### **Latest Status Update**

[The World Health Organisation \(WHO\)](#) is currently advising that the chance of infection is low if you are not in the countries most affected or have not had direct contact with infected people.

Current advice from the NSW Government for parents and affected staff is:

Any student or staff member who has been in, or transited through, mainland China (not just Hubei province) or has been in Iran is excluded from work, school or child care services for 14 days from the date they left mainland China or Iran (as the COVID-19 incubation period can be as long as two weeks).

Any confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded until they are medically cleared to return.

Close contacts of a confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case. Students and staff who have returned to Australia from mainland China more than 14 days ago or from Iran on or after 1 March 2020, and have shown no symptoms during the self-isolation period, are able to return to school or work.

Consistent with current guidelines, children, students and staff who are unwell with respiratory illness should remain at home until symptoms resolve. In accordance with our current practice if any student becomes unwell we will implement our infection control guidelines and follow the advice provided by the NSW Ministry of Health as appropriate.

### **Student Voice**

Last Thursday, Stage 2 and 3 went down to the oval for a cricket gala day hosted by the Sydney Sixers. We played four games of cricket in teams of eight. Stage 3 played in the finals and the winning team was the Stars. The scores were very close and the runners up came second by only one point.



Last week marked the beginning of Lent with a whole school Mass on Ash Wednesday. When we received the ashes on our foreheads the priest's response was; 'repent and believe in the Gospel'. The ashes were the most important symbol because they had been burned on Palm Sunday last year.

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
