CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK and OPEN DAY

Catholic Schools Week is an important time to celebrate the sense of belonging within our school community and the launch of the enrolment period for 2021. Our Open Morning is planned for 17 March from 9:15am. We hope to welcome new prospective parents and students to our school as we open classrooms and showcase the spiritual, academic and creative opportunities offered here at St Cecilia's. If you have a younger child ready to start school in 2021 it is important to collect an enrolment package from the office or download it from our web page and return it at your earliest convenience.

During our Open Morning we will also hold our *Open to Learning Morning* when we invite all parents to visit their children in the classroom. It is also a good opportunity to visit other classes and get a feel for the open classroom structure in the primary grades.

CORONAVIRUS

As a systemic school in the Broken Bay Diocese we must follow the Department of Health and Catholic School NSW Guidelines regarding prevention strategies, increased control measures and surveillance for COVID-19 ('novel coronavirus').

Therefore, we ask for your co-operation in following these requirements to assist us in keeping our school community as safe as possible. We ask that you do not attend a school Open Day event if you meet one of the criteria below:

- Been in contact with a confirmed case of coronavirus (even if free of symptoms).
- Respiratory problems.
- Gastro type symptoms.
- Travelled to China, Thailand, Hong Kong, Japan, Singapore, Indonesia, South Korea, Iran, Italy or Cambodia in the last 14 days.
- If you have been instructed to self-isolate for any reason

If you do not meet any of the above criteria, our school looks forward to welcoming you during our Open Day and Gala Day activities

In the event that our school has to be closed due to COVID-19 ('novel coronavirus') teachers will be setting up learning tasks that can be accessed and completed from home. For students in Years 2 to 6 this will be posted on google classrooms. Kindergarten and year 1 will use *SeeSaw*. Teachers working from home will be able to monitor and provide feedback in real time using these online platforms. Login details will be emailed home if and when required.

LEARNING TOGETHER PLAYGROUP 17 MARCH

Our Learning Together Playgroups will run again this year for all families with a toddler of any age. Friends of the family are also welcome. Our playgroup is held twice a term, once on a Tuesday and once on a Friday. Please come along and meet other mums and dads in the school.

We are looking for a volunteer who would be happy to set up the Tuesday playgroup. We will only need your help three times this year as the first one, which takes place on our Open Day on the 17 March is covered.

NAPLAN 2020

This year NAPLAN for Years 3 and 5 will be held from 12 - 22 May. NAPLAN is a national assessment and our students will participate *Online*. Year 3 and 5 will complete the Reading, Conventions of Language, and Numeracy test *Online*. Year 5 will also complete the Writing test *Online* whilst Year 3 will complete the Writing test as a written paper. I can confirm the children will be given the opportunity to practise the computer skills needed to complete the assessment at school. Parents need to remember not to make a big fuss of the assessment and to ensure the children don't become anxious. Please ensure that you do not plan a family holiday during this time.

READING WORKSHOP KINDERGARTEN AND YEAR 1 PARENTS TUESDAY 17 MARCH 7:30PM

Kindergarten parents are invited to attend a workshop aimed at supporting you to help your child with reading at home. When parents and the school work together to assist students the child always benefits. Any parent with a Year 1 child or older who is struggling to get their child to read at home is also welcome to attend. We have intentionally made the meeting quite late as we are mindful of parents needing to attend to the normal bedtime routines of young children and would like as many parents to attend as possible.

HEAVEN ON EARTH

Heaven on Earth is a spiritual experience we offer parents three times a year. It is a chance for the school to support parents' understanding of Catholic life and culture as well as our relationship with the parish community. It is a wonderful experience of prayer through personal meditation. All are welcome.

PBL is a framework to work in a positive way to enhance skills and create a positive environment. This is a whole school approach for proactive strategies to define, teach & support appropriate behaviours. This includes the use of consistent language and the redesign of environments based on problem solving, whilst clearly defining expectations.

Our valued teacher, Terri Smith, gave an overview of the matrix for SCB based on the core values and asked for parent feedback, noting that Chris Bignold (Advisory Committee Chair) is also on the PBL team. I found the reminder to keep it consistent from home to the school, is a key component in your child's behaviour.

Volunteering is going well; we thank all the volunteers to date.

Meals on Wheels has now filled all fortnightly spots to September, so we have sought to re-engage with the weekly routine.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM NEWS

2020/2021 Children's Sacramental Program for children in Year 2 (and older)

The Bishop's Office has now finalised the Diocesan Confirmation Program and Confirmation will be celebrated at North Harbour Parish on **Saturday 15 August 2020 at 10.00am, 12 noon and 3.00pm.**

The program commences with a **Sacramental Program Overview Meeting** for parents new to the program on **Tuesday 5 May at 9.30am OR Wednesday 6 May at 7.00pm both in SK Church.** An introduction to the sacramental program including Family Preparation Groups, the role of Group Facilitators and how parents accompany their children (for the sacraments of Confirmation, First Reconciliation and First Communion) in our parish based, family centered process will be explained at this meeting.

A Confirmation Information Meeting for all parents will be held on Tuesday 16 June at 9.30am OR Wednesday 17 June at 7.00pm both in SK Church. Fr Dave will speak on the sacrament and explain why the Sacrament of Confirmation is the first sacrament the children will receive in the Diocese of Broken Bay and how this differs from other dioceses and overseas. How the sacramental preparation and age the children receive this sacrament may be different from the parent's experience and why this can be confusing. The role of the school and special religious education classes in supporting the program, the process and time frame for this sacrament including final details of Family Preparation Groups and booking a date via TryBooking will also be provided.

A copy of the full **2020/2021 Children's Sacramental Program** and information on how and when to **Enrol** will be available in coming weeks.
