

CORONAVIRUS

In the event that schools are closed

Teachers have now set up Google Classrooms or Seesaw for all grades. These platforms will be monitored each day by the class teacher and home learning will be set daily. As a school we will continue to communicate with you using our normal communication methods, Compass, newsletters, and emails.

Years 2 to 6 will use Google Classrooms. Please check that your child knows their log in details and can access Google Classrooms from home.

General Instructions

- 1. On any computer with access to the internet, go to your browser eg. Google Chrome
- 2. Search for Google Classroom
- 3. Click on the link to go to: classroom.google.com

- 4. Select use another account
- 5. Enter child's school email address: XXXXXX@dbbstu.catholic.edu.au
- 6. Select NEXT and arrive at the CEnet log in screen
- 7. Enter Child's Username: XXXXXX
- 8. Enter child's own private school password
- 9. Select Google Classroom tile-Title provided by class teacher
- 10. Use the supplied class code to join

Kindergarten and Year 1 are using Seesaw: The Learning Journal

Please download the app onto an iPad or android device.

Each Kindergarten student present at school today received an *At Home Learning Pack* to take home. It includes activity booklets and home learning codes for Seesaw. Parents and students will have access to Seesaw at home should the school close and students are unable to attend school. You



will be notified once access is granted. We ask that you do not complete the tasks in the booklets until notified.

Both Year 1 classes will be using the platform Seesaw and assigned similar tasks which will be set every evening for the following day, in the event of school closures. This week, students will learn how to access this platform on their devices at home. Instructions and QR codes will also be sent to parents directly in the event of a closure:

The following Key considerations have been outlined by the Department of Education:

Parent responsibilities during remote learning

Provide support for your children by:

- establishing routines and expectations
- defining a space for your child to work in
- monitoring communications from teachers
- beginning and ending each day with a check-in
- taking an active role in helping your children process their learning
- encouraging physical activity and/or exercise
- checking in with your child regularly to help them manage stress
- monitoring how much time your child is spending online
- keeping your children social, but set rules around their social media interactions.

Student responsibilities during remote learning

These responsibilities should be adjusted according to the age of your child:

- establishing and/or following a daily routine for learning
- identifying a safe, comfortable, quiet space in their home where they can work effectively and successfully
- regularly monitoring digital platforms and communication to check for learning tasks and feedback from teachers
- completing tasks with integrity and academic honesty, doing your best work
- doing your best to complete assigned tasks
- communicating proactively with your teachers if you require additional support
- complying with the schools' Acceptable use policy for internet/intranet and network services in the Diocesan School System.
- seeking out and communicating with school staff as different needs arise.

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
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
