## **Principal's News**

ROME - Pope Francis prayed for families who are cooped up in their homes and for all those who are ill with COVID-19. During a live broadcast of his daily morning Mass March 16, Pope Francis again prayed for the many people who have fallen ill and for families who, like all citizens, have been required to isolate themselves in their homes to slow the spread of the coronavirus. "I am thinking of the families under lockdown, children who aren't going to school, parents who cannot leave the house, some who are in quarantine," he said at the beginning of Mass.

"May the Lord help them discover new ways, new expressions of love, of living together in this new situation," he said. "It is a wonderful occasion for rediscovering true affection with creativity in the family. Let us pray for families so that relationships in the family at this time always thrive for the good," he said.

#### ENROLLING NOW FOR 2021

New families seeking enrolment are able to book a private tour of the school. Simply phone the office to make an appointment. For existing families enrolment forms are available online or from the school office.

#### **CORONAVIRUS**

Our children are handling the news surrounding Covid-19 really well. From time to time it is normal for the children to develop anxiety about Coronavirus. Our school counsellor has sent me the <u>link</u> to a child friendly explanation of the virus you may like to use with your children.

Whilst our school remains open, we respect the right of parents to decide whether you send your child to school or keep them at home.

From today there is no need to enter your child's absence if your child is staying home due to the current COVID-19 situation. Your child will be automatically assigned the 'Flexible' code via the school.

Our classes are set up for remote home learning. In doing so consideration has been given to access to internet, age of students, stage of learning, and the nature of the Key Learning Area.

Therefore, remote home learning at St Cecilia's adopts a blended learning approach. This includes use of available learning and teaching technologies with learning activities being delivered online, digitally and non-digitally. Years 2-6 are using Google Classrooms whilst K-1 are using Seesaw. These platforms are monitored each day by the class teacher and home learning is set daily. As a school we will continue to communicate with you using our normal communication methods, Compass, newsletters, and emails.

Years 2 to 6 will use **Google Classrooms**. All children who have been at school know their login details and can access Google Classrooms from home. Please be aware that children have different login details for the various online programs they are accessing. All login details have been sent home either in the child's diary or home learning workbook.

# Kindergarten and Year 1 are using **Seesaw**: The Learning Journal

Please download the app onto an iPad or Android device. Thank you to the parents who have helped their children stay connected by posting that children have completed their home learning on these closed sites.

# The following Key considerations have been outlined by the Department of Education:

#### Parent responsibilities during remote learning

Provide support for your children by:

- establishing routines and expectations
- defining a space for your child to work in
- monitoring communications from teachers
- beginning and ending each day with a check-in
- taking an active role in helping your children process their learning
- encouraging physical activity and/or exercise
- checking in with your child regularly to help them manage stress
- monitoring how much time your child is spending online
- keeping your children social but set rules around their social media interactions.

#### Student responsibilities during remote learning

These responsibilities should be adjusted according to the age of your child:

- establishing and/or following a daily routine for learning
- identifying a safe, comfortable, quiet space in their home where they can work effectively and successfully
- regularly monitoring digital platforms and communication to check for learning tasks and feedback from teachers
- completing tasks with integrity and academic honesty, doing your best work
- doing their best to complete assigned tasks
- communicating proactively with their teachers if they require additional support
- complying with the schools' Acceptable use policy for internet/intranet and network services in the Diocesan School System.
- seeking out and communicating with school staff as different needs arise.

We are conscious of the need to keep parents connected during these unprecedented times. We are setting up closed **Facebook** pages for each year group that will be connected to the school Facebook page. Class parents will be the moderators of these pages. Families will then be able to connect with each other and share home isolation stories. The pages will not be a means of connecting with teachers. *Google Classrooms, Seesaw* and email will remain the preferred method of teacher communication.

These pages should be ready to launch later this week.
